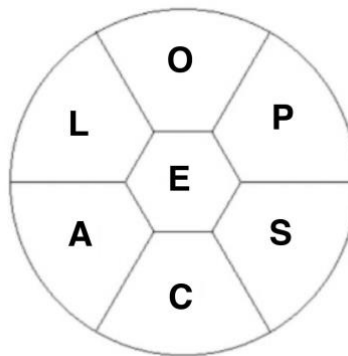


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CLUE #5

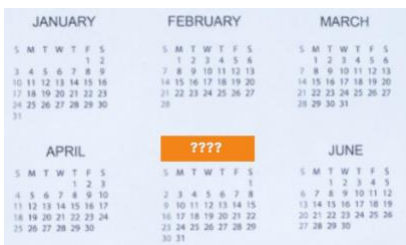
Our own version of the NY Times Spelling Bee! Follow these rules to find the clue answer:

Math & Map Fun.

Head to this link – tinyurl.com/UAannexmap. Click on the diagonal arrows in the map's upper right corner to expand the image. Use the "+" key in the center top to zoom in. (Note: It can take a moment for the map to load and the text to become clear. Be patient ☹)

This annexation map shows the date that every part of today's UA was annexed into our city. Find these places on the map and use the portion of the date indicated to calculate the answer.

MM = 2-digit month

DD = 2-digit day

YYYY = 4-digit year

1. Start with the YYYY that Scioto Country Club was annexed into UA.
2. Add the DD that the land where our high school sits was annexed into UA.
3. Divide by the MM that the land where the Upper Arlington Gateway is being built was annexed into UA.
4. Add the YYYY that the land where Hastings Middle School sits was annexed into UA.
5. Divide by the DD that the land where Wyandot Park sits was annexed into UA.
6. Multiply by the MM that the land where Kingsdale sits was annexed into UA.
